SCHOOL READINESS ACTIVITIES

This term, the 440 children will be engaging and sharing the enjoyment of language and text, whilst playing at our school area. They will develop an understanding that symbols are a powerful means of communication and that ideas, thoughts and concepts can be represented through them.

As we enter the second half of the year, it is very important that children take on roles of literacy and numeracy users in their play.

The Term 3 Program will be focussed around the children building on their self-help skills & fine motor skills:

- cutting paper or play dough
- developing a pincer grip when drawing or writing and
- having the confidence to attempt an activity and ask for assistance if necessary.

To challenge themselves, we will be asking the children to:

- firstly, try something new before going to a play station they are comfortable with
- follow instructions
- be aware of others and
- help when needed,

We will be practicing our self-help skills, which become life skills, in preparation for school ie: putting on our jackets and zipping up our bags. Sensory experiences will allow the children to relax, squeeze and squish different textures, laugh, enhance their vocabulary and make a fun mess! The variety of play spaces will allow the children to explore, role play and extend their skills on their own or with others.

CURRENT IMMUNISATION HISTORY STATEMENTS

A number of our children are due or were recently due for their vaccinations. We would appreciate parents providing us with an updated Medicare Immunisation History Statement for our records as soon as possible please.

An updated IHS is also a requirement of the 2022 enrolment process and applications cannot be processed and enrolment confirmed without this document.

PLANTING FOR THE FUTURE

It has always been part of our phased environmental sustainability and preservation plan, that we continue to re-vegetate our outdoor environment. This week, our Bush Kinder and 440 Wednesday & Friday groups are planting out native shrubs and grasses in bush kinder and the playground. Together with Tristy, Kathleen & Ali and Finch's mum Megan, they are learning about the importance of re-vegetation and the benefits their efforts will reap in the short and long term. By the children participating in the planting and placement of the tubes, they will gain a sense of pride in their contribution and a greater care in seeing them thrive.

On a grown-up level, the benefits to the bush kinder and playground environs are:

- <u>Reduced Maintenance</u>. Equipped with natural protections, native plants are resistant to disease, drought, and pests and grow happily without the need of pesticides.
- <u>Soil and Water Conservation</u>. Native plants' growth habits keep soil in place, store water where it's most needed, and stop storm water from running off into waterways.
- Refuge for Wildlife. Planting natives allows us to build natural habitats custom-designed to accommodate our local fauna and insects.
- <u>Versatile Plant Groupings</u>. There are native plants (many with multi-seasonal interest) suited to every planting site; we've chosen ones that grow in dry shade, sun-drenched rock gardens & boggy wetlands,
