Welcome to our second newsletter of the pre-school year. We hope you are all looking forward to working alongside us in this exciting developmental stage of your child's learning. Each month our Program Plans will be displayed outside on the parent noticeboard for all to view. Please feel free to discuss any area of these Programs with your child's teacher.

Our learning through play will continue to progress well throughout our monthly activities. The children will continue to build on new skills daily; please encourage these at home.

Our 440 children have been doing activities where they need to recognise their name tags, identify the sounds of language, letter — sound relationships and the concept of print. Identifying and naming difference emotions / colour mixing using water droppers, taking turns engaging in shared games with rules / small world play; creating and acting out scenes/scenarios real and pretend / Construction / Puzzle & Activity / Literacy & Numeracy corners / Group Time.

Our 340 program has been introducing the children to ice painting using red, blue & yellow ice cubes to explore with solids and liquids. Play doh; manipulating the dough using fingers, hands, rollers and cutters to build fine motor skills and small hand muscles. Music and movement (preparation for our Welcome to Kinder Show Night / Library Corner / Home Corner for the children to play in a solitary, parallel or social play stage — taking turns and developing language.

Bush Kinder is now in its second week and is currently at capacity with 14 children thriving on outdoor play and exploration. Tristy, Kathleen and the children are photographing & identifying bugs and finding out their English and Japanese names, building cubbys, talking about our BK safety rules and experiencing small risk taking, imagination, conflict resolution, gross and fine motor development. Everyone seems happy to swap iPads, computers and toys for trees, mud and dirt!

Whilst kindergarten marks an important transition, it is important that children still get to be children. Kindergarten life is sweet, with all the run and exciting activities. Let's gear up for a successful year!

AFTER KINDER CARE IN 2021

PICKING UP & DROPPING OFF YOUR CHILDREN

Albury Wodonga Health Dental Service Dental Screening Program



Dear Parent/guardian,

To complement the work conducted by Albury Wodonga Health Dental Services, Oral Health Therapists and Dental Assistants will be visiting your service to conduct a screening program.

Why does my child need a dental check?

All children are at risk of developing tooth decay, 1 in 3 children aged five and under who attended Victorian public dental clinics in 2010-11 experienced tooth decay. Dental decay is the most prevalent Australian childhood disease and the 5th most common cause of hospitalisation in 0-4year olds. The good news is that tooth decay is largely preventable. Establishing sound oral health and healthy eating habits from an early age provides the best chance of maintaining good oral health into adulthood

Staff specialising in dental treatment for children will attend your service to carry out a range of preventive services including:

- Oral health screening
- Dental hygiene advice
- Fluoride varnish applications to early signs of dental decay if detected

Participation is **voluntary** with **no cost** to families. If your child requires further assessment a referral will be provided for your child to attend the Albury Wodonga Health Dental clinic.

Your child's involvement in this program is completely voluntary and you may withdraw from the program at any time. All kindergarten and primary school children are eligible for free dental treatment at Albury Wodonga Health dental clinic. Information gathered is confidential. You will be informed if it is recommended that your child requires further dental assessment or treatment. You will be notified when staff will be attending your kindergarten/school.

Please complete and sign the screening consent form [avail next to the appointment schedule clipboards] and return it to the kinder office.

Enjoying moments of solitude can help children recognise their individual achievements. Some of our activities are purposefully designed for one to increase capacity, self-regulation and opportunities for new learnings.

Our wonderful new wicking beds

Did you know that wicking beds were originally designed for use in Ethiopia with the aim to increase food production whilst using approximately 50% less water?

Last year, we started looking at this brilliant innovation for our kinder as a way to more reliably grow fruit, veg and herbs. We know from experience that the planting is the easy part of the process and that keeping the produce alive and flourishing is the real challenge!

We now have 5 wicking beds in-situ; water reservoirs installed, beds filled and planted out with lettuce, chives, silverbeet, cucumbers, sunflowers, broccolini and peas.

All of this has been achieved by parent **Donna Hall** and we are immensely grateful for her time, efforts and knowledge. Under her tutelege, we are looking forward to saving time and water whilst producing lush, healthy and unstressed veggies regardless of the heat of the season. Fingers crossed for bumper crops!





YACKANDANDAH KINDER IS A NUT-FREE CENTRE

The kindergarten currently has a child who is anaphylactic to nuts and products containing nuts.

We are very conscious of our duty of care to ensure the safety of these children whilst attending kinder and we actively encourage our families to become peanut and nut allergen aware and to help staff maintain an environment that will minimize the risk of exposure to nut allergens. In the event that accidental exposure may occur, the Kinder has an emergency response First Aid procedure in place.

Avoidance of peanut/nut products is the cornerstone of management in preventing an anaphylactic reaction in a child suffering from a nut allergy.

Your assistance is vital and due to these health risks, we ask for your understanding & co-operation by <u>not</u> sending any food with your child containing NUT PRODUCTS.

It is just a matter of double-checking food labels before putting snacks in the child's lunchbox. It is recommended that ALL NUTS should be avoided as most nuts are processed with peanuts & therefore cross contamination may occur. It is also possible to have an allergy to more than one kind of nut. Parents are also asked to ensure collage materials (eg boxes/plastic containers) are free from possible contamination by washing thoroughly or shaking out crumbs/dust etc.


